

PREDOMINANTLY WHITE INSTITUTIONS (PWI)



PWIs are defined as institutions of higher learning in which Whites account for 50% or greater of the student enrollment.



HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES (HBCU)

HBCUs are institutions that were established before the Civil Rights Act of 1964 with the intention of primarily serving the African-American community, although all students are welcome to attend.



There are 101 HBCUs in the United States, some of which are Morehouse College, Spelman College, Florida A&M, Howard University, Southern University, Hampton University, Dillard University, and Xavier University of New Orleans.



HISPANIC SERVING INSTITUTIONS (HSI)



Defined as an institution with at least 25% Hispanic students. There are hundreds of HSIs across the United States. Some institutions designated as an HSI are:

- San Francisco State University
- Sonoma State University
- University of Arizona
- University of Houston
- John Jay College of Criminal Justice



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Application Dates

EARLY DECISION I: Binding Agreement Deadline in October or November

EARLY DECISION II: Binding Agreement Deadline is later in the admission cycle

EARLY ACTION I: Non-Binding Agreement Deadline in November

EARLY ACTION II: Non-Binding Agreement Deadline typically in January

REGULAR DECISION: Non-Binding Agreement Deadline in January

What is a school profile?

- It is a guide about a school that provides information about the student body, academic policies, and courses offered at the school.
- Includes school location, contact information, students demographics, the percentage of students who attend 2-year and 4-year colleges, Honors/Advanced Placement/IB/other Advanced classes.
- Schools use their profiles to provide information about their institution.

Morris Jeff has a profile, highlighting the International Baccalaureate Program and the students' accepted colleges and universities, on its website.

- Type of High School: What is unique?
- Type of Classes:What is the breadth and depth?
- Content of Classes: Something unique?
- Grades Received in Classes: All Four Years?
- College Courses Taken: Challenged and focused?
- Summer Academic Program: How time was spent?
